Only a dentist that has completed a further 3–5 years of specialist training in orthodontics can call themselves an orthodontist.

Before any orthodontic treatment can be considered, it is extremely important that the teeth are healthy, and the cleaning is very good. Diet, toothbrushing and regular visits to the dentist are essential and thumb sucking habits should also have stopped.

IF YOUR CHILD DOESN'T QUALIFY FOR HSE ORTHODONTIC TREATMENT

IS ORTHODONTIC TREATMENT STILL BENEFICIAL?

The Index of Orthodontic Treatment Need (IOTN) is the international standard used by HSE specialist orthodontists to determine whether or not your child qualifies for HSE orthodontic treatment. The Dental Health component grades the need for Orthodontic treatment on a 1 - 5 scale, with Grade 5 indicating extreme dental health problems and therefore greatest need. Crowding is judged by severity of the crowding in conjunction with the "dental attractiveness" of the teeth using the scale Aesthetic Component (AC) with 10 indicating the "worst" category. The IOTN standard is an objective and reliable way to select those children who will benefit most from treatment and is a fair way to prioritise limited resources.

What if your child does not qualify for HSE orthodontic treatment? A beautiful smile increases confidence and selfesteem. If your child is unhappy with the appearance of their teeth, it is advisable to seek a consultation appointment with a specialist orthodontist in private practice for treatment advice.

Did you know...? Most specialist orthodontists offer a monthly payment plan. **Tax relief** can be claimed on private orthodontic treatment at the standard rate of tax.
