'Be wary of quick fix orthodontics'

WICKLOW specialist orthodontists is advising people against six month treatment and potentially negative outcomes at quick fix clinics saying specialist orthodontic treatment is the best way to straighten teeth and achieve a healthy lifelong smile at any age

Orthodontists who represent a highly specialized and valued branch of dentistry are growing increasingly concerned at reports of patients dissatisfied with the results of treatments used by some cosmetic dentists at 'smile clinics' to straighten teeth and are having to rectify some of these failed treatments.

Dr Frances Brandon, Specialist Orthodontist, Bray, Co. Wicklow and OSI member said: "It is never too late to consider specialist orthodontic treatment, because healthy teeth can be moved at any age."
