Dr Emer O'Leary, a specialist orthodontist and registered on the specialist list with the Irish Dental Council has joined the clinic and will be providing all kinds of orthodontic treatment for children and adults. She will also be providing the latest advances in orthodontics such as invisible braces and tooth coloured brackets. The clinic is mindful of the difficult times that we are in and is therefore offering payment plans to patients so that the financial burden is spread over a period of up to eighteen months. For example for a 12 year old child who needs upper and lower braces the cost is approximately €150 per month and an initial payment of €200. Consultations are free.

Dr Curtin started out in January 2004 with three members of staff and now has a team of fourteen. She is delighted to have Dr John Browne specialist endodontist as a member of her team and it is great that specialist root canal treatments can be carried out in house.

Patients who have had bad experiences with root canal treatments find John very reassuring and are immediately put at ease by his manner and expertise.

Much more than a dentist

Dr Grainne Kieran has been practising at Corabbey Dental and Orthodontics since 2007 and in the last year Dr Elizabeth Ann Ryan and Dr Gilbert Lysaght have also joined the team. The clinic also employs two dental hygienists Karen Hayes and Eileen Allen.

As well as dentistry, the clinic also offers wrinkle reduction treatments. These treatments have been provided by Dr Carmel Curtin for many years.

The ideal treatment for reducing our wrinkles should be predictable, non-invasive and safe. Botox and dermal fillers satisfy these requirements very well. Botox is ideal for reducing frown lines and the crow's feet around our eyes. The effect generally lasts for 3-4 months but patients who avail of botox will find that after 3 or 4 treatments the result will last for longer. Are there risks? A very thorough medical history needs to be carried out initially to rule out any

reasons why you may not be suitable.

Dermal fillers tend to last for 9 months and are mainly used for the nasolabial folds (*run from the corner of the nose to corner of mouth*) and the 'sad' lines (*run from the corner of our mouths downwards*).
